

## Early Years Pupil Premium 2023-2024

### Spend and Rationale

All children at Colleges Nursery School receive personalised provision and support, by having access to experienced and highly trained staff who create an early year's curriculum, which is constantly under review and designed to offer the maximum flexibility to meet the needs of the children. Staff meet regularly to share, review and plan for children's progress.

Once we have notification that a child is eligible for Early Years Pupil Premium, we will arrange to meet with parents to discuss the needs of their child. We attempt to be as creative and flexible in our approach to supporting children's learning. Individualising EYPP spending is particularly important due to the low numbers of eligible children.
